2 in 5 college TGQN are victims of sexual assault

"If all four tactics (physical or threat of physical force, incapacitation, coercion, failure to obtain affirmative consent) are included in an overall prevalence measure, the AAU Survey estimates that 21.2 percent of seniors were victims since first enrolling at the IHE. One-third (33.1%) of senior females and 39.1 percent of seniors identifying as TGQN report being a victim of nonconsensual sexual contact at least once" (p. XIV).
